How to Propose a Constitutional or By-Law Amendment

1. Prior to the Annual General Meeting, any proposals for constitutional change or by-law change should be presented to the secretary in the following format:

Existing article in its current form

Proposed changes or amendment in italics, any removals are struck through.

Rationale for the proposal

- 2. The secretary and/or executive board will review the proposal and return it for any corrections or changes it as necessary.
- 3. The final proposal that will be presented to the General Membership must be submitted to the secretary prior to the NISCA Meeting #2. The proposal can then be presented in the "New Business" section of NISCA Meeting #3 at the National Conference.

By-Law Amendment Proposal EXAMPLE

Current By-Law:

SECTION 2 Term of office:

a. Committee Chairs shall hold office for one (1) year.

Proposed Change:

SECTION 2 Term of office:

a. Committee Chairs shall hold office for one (1) year- two(2) years.

Rational:

Committee chairs are an integral part of the organization and consistency throughout a presidential term is paramount to the smooth functioning of the organization.
